Dear Friends of the Foundation.

What a joy!

As this semester draws to a close, we're happy to have been able to relaunch our residential programs and our events in New York, Montreal, Singapore and Paris. These meetings are great occasions to share ideas and opportunities, vital for building a strategic virtuous cycle.

I can't resist looking back of our initiatives:

Our programs:

A highly successful graduation trip to Montreal for the *Women in Business: BEcome a Leader program.* Inspiring encounters with Canadian women leaders! We're motivated to repeat the trip for the second intake.

In parallel, we ran the first WIF program with McGill University and CentraleSupélec for confirmed entrepreneurs and senior executives coming from around 10 countries, our *Women Entrepreneurs and Leadership* program.

Our events:

- In New York we ran 2 events, a hybrid format event in March, and on June 14th 2022 another event to get our WIF community off to a flying start.
- In Montréal we held 2 emblematic evenings: on May 17th we reported on European, Canadian and American research, and on May 19th we hosted a magnificent Gala evening at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts.
- In Singapore we wrapped up our first inter-company mentoring program with a dinner for the first intake after they had shared their experience of the program.
- And finally, in Paris, we are all extremely proud to have launched the Alumni Club on the Printemps rooftop terrace. So much sharing and opportunities to come!

Lastly, I cannot forget the success of our online programs that are now part of the Fondation's DNA and permit discussion and debate between companies and continents, with on average more than 10 countries represented per program. We ran our first program with Berkeley on leadership and data, and we are already designing another equally disruptive program.

I should also mention our program on responsible and transformative leadership designed with CentraleSupélec for which we're still exploring the possibilities.

And then as always, another extraordinary program with Stanford, the *Sparking Innovation program*, with the Stanford VMware Women's Leadership Innovation Lab.

I'll also take advantage of this editorial to share my joy and pride at being nominated, as of September 1st 2022, as a member of the GSB Alumni Association Board of Directors.



Our first inter-company mentoring program in Asia finished end April with a dinner at which mentees and mentors gave their testimonials and shared their takeaways from the program held over that special period.






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PARIS
